
FREE AFTER-SCHOOL TUTORING



SPORTS AND AFTERSCHOOL CLUBS

Gililand Middle School offers a variety of opportunities for students to participate in afterschool activities. All clubs and activities are free of charge. These include:

National Junior Honor Society – Open to 6th, 7th, and 8th graders who have demonstrated excellence in five key areas: scholarship, leadership, service, citizenship, and character. To be eligible, students must maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 during previous and current school years.

Student Council – Participants provide student activities, share in management of the school, help problem solve, and help involve students in school affairs.

Guitar Club – Students play music while learning to read notes and strum chords on nylon string classic guitars.

Ping Pong Club – Students work on hand-eye coordination playing table tennis.

Yearbook Club – Members help develop the annual yearbook.

Sports – Gililand Middle School participates in the Tempe Athletic Conference and the All-City Athletic Conference. Sports offered include cross-country, volleyball, soccer, wrestling, softball, basketball, and baseball.

Community Garden – Participants have an opportunity to learn about sustaining a garden by planting flowers, vegetables, and other vegetation.



HONORS CLASSES

Gililand Middle School offers honors classes in all core areas – Math, Language Arts, Social Studies, and Science.

Booster Club – The Booster Club at Gililand works to promote children's health, well-being, and educational success through strong parent, family, and community involvement. DRESS STANDARDS

Although there is not a standard school uniform, Gililand encourages students to take pride in their attire as it relates to the school setting. OUTSTANDING MUSIC PROGRAMS

Here at Gililand we are strong believers in incorporating music education into our students' daily routine. We have a large variety of courses and performing groups that students can participate in. These include band, choir, jazz, orchestra, and electric orchestra. Groups perform in four concerts per year, plus at various community events and festivals.

PBIS – POSITIVE DISCIPLINE PROGRAM

PBIS (Positive Behavioral Intervention Support) is a positive discipline program that has been implemented throughout the Gililand campus. The system establishes school-wide expectations for all students; with these in place, instructional time is increased as problematic behaviors are kept to a minimum. Included in the PBIS system is a positive reward system for students who are caught doing good deeds on campus, such as picking up trash or helping a fellow student. Students can receive "Gotcha" tickets for every good deed they perform (to use for a variety of rewards at the Gotcha store) and other awards in recognition of their behavior and attendance.
